Bins and Bags

NNSA is working to improve waste management in our streets.

This newsletter sets out the story so far and next steps.

In 2022 the Council decided bin hubs were the best solution for Edinburgh City. The proposed hubs would be 8 metres long and contain 6 large communal bins for paper, card, plastic, glass, food and general waste. The plan was to have bin hubs bins on both sides of Northumberland Street, Nelson Street and Abercromby Place at intervals of 100m.

This approach took no account of the visual effect on the New Town, a World Heritage Site or other impacts. The Community Council, working with Street Associations successfully persuaded the Council to agree to a trial of Green Gull Proof Sacks for recycling paper, card and plastic in 10 selected streets, including Northumberland St and Abercromby Place.

If you live in Northumberland Street or Abercromby Place and do not have a Green Gull Proof Sack, small Black Gull Proof Sack or enough clear plastic bags please get in touch.

Communal Bins in Nelson Street

Why does Nelson Street have communal bins?

Dates back to the introduction of Communal Bins more than 10 years ago. Was thought to be more suitable for tenemented streets.

What are the Council's plans for Nelson Street?

The Council proposed in Nov 23 that if the recycling pilot continues to be successful it will be extended throughout the New Town World Heritage Site- including Nelson St. We don't have a date for that.

Are Nelson Street bins for everyone?

No Nelson Street (and Dundas Street) bins are intended only for their residents.. If other people use them they get too full and spill out.

PLEASE DO NOT USE NELSON STREET BINS UNLESS YOU LIVE THERE.

Recycling Pilot Interim Results

The Green Gull Proof Sacks trial has been a success. In the 10 streets taking part, recycling has increased by 250%, (as monitored by Street Associations.). But there seems to be less use of the new small black gull proof sacks.

Phase 2 involved distributing small black gull proof sacks for general waste. This was to bring our waste arrangements into line with wheelie bin capacity elsewhere in the city.

If you live in Abercromby Place or Northumberland Street please use the small black gull proof sacks for your general waste. (Except If you have a wheelie bin collection- that will continue unchanged.)

Food waste

.....

28% of the contents of the Black sacks is currently food waste. If food waste is disposed of in a caddy, it is processed at the Council Millerhill food recycling centre. This produces methane which generates electricity and the residue is turned in liquid fertiliser and sold to farmers.
